WHAT IS AT STAKE?



Parental consent needed to download Therapy Designer app for minors under 17.



"Parental oversight recommended"



MDR Informed consent of the minor's «legally designated representative» needed



No parental consent needed for research participation



Research Ethics Documents:
Minors generally recognized as vulnerable population (reduced autonomy), hence entitled to protection

What are the ethical implications of involving "consenting" minors in research without parents' consent?

Does minor's consent meet criteria of validity?

Are minors a vulnerable population to be protected?

Analysis of Governance Issues

How do distinct age thresholds for consent relate to different regulatory categorizations?

What does it say about the role of Big Tech in regulating new health technologies?

How to tackle harmonization issues across different scales of governance?
